

Workshop harvesting

- Good size, easy to read
- How will the policy work in practice?
- Which environments does this policy apply to e.g. in school / outside of school?
- How is this document relevant to teacher education?
- Does this policy give clear instructions in the case if an adult bullies children?
- Does this document recognize different types of bullying (e.g. social, structural, cultural)
- Should there be suggestions for parents how to work as role models?
- How should we react on the sources of bullying? (For example, Hamarus' dissertation provides models)
- What are the ways to build consistency across the organisations and different stakeholders?
- Will the policy document be "translated" to children?
- What kind of resources are shared for enacting this policy?
- How will cross-disciplinary collaboration be promoted?
- Will there be a strong enough programme to advance 'good behavior'?
- Children may behave very differently at school and at home.
- Parents are as different as children/young and should be treated accordingly.
 - Some parents want to be involved in handling bullying, others not.
